Reentry Volunteer Opportunities

The Broome County Council of Churches' Jail Ministry Program is committed to addressing reentry in regards to spirituality, life skills, mental health, addiction and basic human needs in an effort to restore wholeness and wellbeing to the ex-offenders and their families. We have developed a reentry leadership team, staff and volunteer core to address these issues in a systematic fashion.

Our reentry program is in the process of becoming more decentralized with a growing number of area congregations offering support. Teams of three people, centered in local congregations, will be providing mentoring with the context of a friendship. Social work background is not required as our staff will handle any referrals above the abilities of the team. Ongoing training, and support is provided. Christmas Project

Each year area volunteers, businesses, civic groups and faith communities participate in our Jail Ministry Christmas project. We provide for some of the ongoing needs such as clothing, hygiene kits, food and shelter referrals and family intervention for inmates as they are discharged. We provide gifts of children's books to the families of inmates and we give a small gift bag to each inmate containing a few items. It is our way of telling the incarcerated and their families that their community has not completely given up all hope for their change.

If you could help in any way with donations of playing cards, word puzzle books, full size hygiene items (we do have enough bar soap however), pocket packs of tissues, stamps, single trip bus basses, sweat suits, socks, underwear, hats, gloves, gently used or new children's books, we would be most grateful. Volunteers are also needed to help decorate gift bags, sort items and wrap and/or deliver the children's books.

We are holding a Wrapping Party Thursday, December 18. RSVP required.

Amnesty International Write for Rights Invitation

For fifty-three years the organization Amnesty International has supported people who are imprisoned unjustly. Using the name "prisoners of conscience" for people whose human rights are violated by governments, Amnesty International publicizes their cases worldwide and intervenes to win, for many, freedom, restoration of legal process, or an end to torture. We in the small local Quaker group (the Binghamton Community Friends Meeting) have participated in this campaign since 1987, sending letters to officials of repressive governments and cards to the prisoners themselves. For the 2014 "Write for Rights" campaign we offer letters, drafted by Amnesty International, which you can send to support prisoners of conscience around the world. We invite you to pick up as many as 17 letters and addressed envelopes at 5 PM on Sunday, December 7, at Sarah Jane Johnson Memorial United Methodist Church, 308 Main Street at Baldwin Street, Johnson City. Enter from the parking lot on the south side. Please call or email Ralph McGrew at 722 0467 or mcgrewrv@sunybroome.edu to indicate your interest and the number of letters you would like to send, so that we can have a sufficient supply. If this time and place are not convenient for you, we will be happy to

get your letters to you in another way. We supply the letters and envelopes free of charge. Sending all 17 letters would cost you about \$18 in postage; you may choose to send any smaller number. You may insert your signature and address to send the letters just as we supply them; you may add notes of your own; you may retype or rewrite letters in your own words, following Amnesty International's suggestions on format; or you may send messages electronically. We ask that you send letters promptly, to be most persuasive. The Write for Rights campaign website is http://write.amnestyusa.org/?ac=none_r. Thank you.



Hanukkah House Museum of Temple Concord

9 Riverside Drive, Binghamton, NY

The Hanukkah House Museum of Temple Concord is a seasonal teaching museum, housed in the Kilmer Mansion. This is its 18th year of operation.

The museum is open to the public beginning Tuesday, Nov. 18, at 5 p.m. and closing Sunday, Dec. 28. Hours are Tuesday, Saturday and Sunday from noon to 4 p.m. and Thursday from 4 to 8 p.m. It is closed on Thanksgiving.

The theme for 2014 is <u>Kilmer Mansion and Family</u>. Highlighted will be different aspects of the Kilmer family, their homes and businesses. The Kilmer Mansion was designed and built in 1898 by local architect Edward Vosbury in the Italian Renaissance and Queen Anne style. The Kilmer family had diverse successful businesses in addition to the well-known Swamp Root, such as newspapers and horse racing. Pictures of the family, their mansion and other real estate will be displayed.

Organizers hope to give students and visitors a sense of the historic aspect of the Hanukkah story with tableaus and models, descriptive information and a sense of how the holiday is celebrated around the world. Also returning is a miniature recreation of living on the Lower East Side of New York at the turn of the century.

The story of Hanukkah is told in different mediums in the museum, fabric, written words, movies, diorama and hands on activities. There are displays of antique oil burning menorahs as well as traditional and contemporary menorahs. Dreidels, menorahs, and yamulkas displays are quite impressive.

Hands on activities delight guests of all ages. The "Kids Place" has hands on learning games, books and puzzles for kids of all ages.

The expanded Judaic Gift Shop features a wide selection of Judaica for Hanukkah and other life cycle celebrations. The gift shop is open during museum hours, except Saturdays.

If a club advisor/leader is looking for an interesting activity, he or she should schedule a field trip to the museum. Groups of all sizes are welcome.


